Lagoon Update

Due to several factors, including the fact the Sandy Beach/Sunrise Beach sewage lagoon is at or near capacity, the Summer Village of Sunrise Beach has entered into an agreement with the Town of Onoway to have Sunrise Beach's wastewater effluent hauled to the Onoway sewage lagoon. Please be advised that effective May 1st, 2018 the Summer Village will no longer be covering disposal fees charged by the Town of Onoway for disposing effluent in their lagoon, this fee will have to be paid by the property owner to the waste water hauler.

Correct Mailing Addresses

Are you new to the Summer Village?? Did you move recently?? It is **important that the Summer Village Administration Office has your current mailing address**. Without your current mailing address, your Tax notice may not be properly delivered and that could lead to **delays & penalties**.

Fires can happen! ...ARE YOU COVERED??



Did you know that there is a cost for fire suppression charged by the fire department for a structure fire and is payable by the **property owner?** In our area, we have seen structures fires as high as \$28,000 and wildland fires as high as \$12,000.

Will your insurance cover these costs? What does your policy say?

Be sure to check your home insurance policy or talk to your insurance agent about what exactly your policy covers and how much it covers. Besides inquirying about your home structure fire insurance, we encourage you to have a conversation with respect to wildland insurance (a grass fire that could happen that never reaches a building).

Also be advised that should the fire department be dispatched to your residence as a result of a home alarm (even if it is a false alarm) or medical response including STARS landing or a passerby sees smoke and calls 9-1-1, you as the property owner, will receive an invoice for these calls.

FIRE BANS

Within the Municipal boundaries of the Summer Village and when affected by the order of a FIRE BAN, residents must immediately proceed to extinguish every outdoor fire and recreational fire lit and every fire located on land occupied or owned

PROPERTY TAXES

For several years now the Summer Village has charged a \$300.00 special tax on all properties that covered certain expenses (fire, roads, physician recruitment). For the 2018 taxation year Council has decided to start the shift from a special tax to a minimum municipal tax for all properties. So for 2018 each property will be charged a \$200.00 special tax and a \$600.00 minimum municipal tax. The concept of a minimum municipal tax is that all properties, whether improved or vacant, whether they have a 2,000 square ft house or a cabin, utilize the same services (roads, street lights, public works, assessment, administration, auditor, Council etc). As a result of this change, lower assessed properties will see an increase in their municipal tax dollars paid.

Your property taxes

The Summer Village collects taxes annually to meet the projected costs of providing services to the community. These revenues are received through grants, a special tax (fire, water & recreation), and the municipal portion of property taxes. Other amounts collected on your annual tax bill are collected on behalf of the Lac Ste. Anne Seniors Foundation and the Alberta School Foundation Fund. Combined Assessment & Property Tax Notices were mailed out May 14th, 2018. Property taxes are due July 31st, 2018.

Assessment

Property assessment services are contracted to Municipal Assessment Services Group Inc. and can be contacted by phone at 780-939-3310 with any questions you may have regarding the assessed value of your property.

What is a Property Assessment?

Each year, the Assessor will inspect certain properties within the Municipality. The property assessment is the estimated market value of your property which is used to calculate property taxes. Assessors do not create your property value, nor does Council. The market determines the value of your property, and that value is the basis for the assessment and is then used to calculate your property taxes.

What If I Disagree with My Assessment?

Remember, you can only make a complaint against your assessment value, not your tax dollars or rates and you must have grounds for your complaint. New legislation allows you 60 days from the date of your assessment notice to make an assessment complaint.

The assessment complaint deadline for the Summer Village is July 23rd, 2018. There is a fee of \$50.00 that must accompany a completed assessment complaint form which is available on the website www.summervillageofsunrisebeach.ca or by contacting the office at 780-967-0271. Prior to completing the assessment complaint form, please contact the assessor to first discuss the matter of your assessment (not your tax dollars) – Municipal Assessment Services Group Inc. – 780-939-3310.

Household Waste



The Summer Village of Sunrise Beach has a contract in place with GFL Environmental Inc. GFL personnel will be picking up your household waste every 2nd Tuesday during the winter months (Oct to April) and every Tuesday during the summer months (May - Sept). We are now on weekly service!

Please have your garbage carts out before Tuesday morning for pickup & bring them back in after your waste has been picked up.

Clean, Drain, Dry Your Boat!

Clean

- -Clean and inspect watercraft, trailer and gear
- -Remove all plants, animals, and mud at the access area or dock
- -At home, soak your gear in a bleach solution for at least one minute
- -Rinse, scrub or pressure wash your boat away from storm drains, ditches or waterways



On land, before leaving the waterbody, drain all water from:

-Bait buckets

-Ballast

-Coolers

-Internal compartments

-Livewells

-Bilges

Dry

- -Dry the watercraft and gear completely between trips and allow the wet areas of your boat to air dry.
- -Leave compartments open and sponge out standing water.
